Glossary

Attendance mode: Full-time students undertake at least 75% of their load on-campus and part-time students do less than 75%. External students undertake their courses off-campus and are nearly always (91%) enrolled on a part-time basis.

Commencement status: Commencing students are those who enrolled in a course for the first time between 1 September of the year prior to the reference year and 31 August of the reference year.

Funding source: PECS was a new category introduced in 2002 which refers to the Postgraduate Education Loan Scheme. BOTPLS was a new category introduced in 2003 which refers to Bridging Scheme for Overseas Trained Professionals Loan.

Revenue: HECS refers to contributions actually received from students through the Higher Education Contributions Scheme and to advanced payments received from the Commonwealth Government through the scheme.

Monash University in brief

Monash University enrolled its first students at the Clayton campus in 1961 when the university consisted of the faculties of Arts, Economics and Politics, Engineering, Medicine and Science. It is now Australia's largest university with almost 52,000 students enrolled at its six Australian campuses at Berwick, Caulfield, Clayton, Gippsland, Parkville and Peninsula and its overseas campuses in Malaysia and South Africa.

The university engages in an extensive range of high quality research and provides a wide range of undergraduate and postgraduate programs via conventional and flexible study modes including distance education and open learning. Today, some 8500 students study off-campus and increasingly online. The university's research and coursework programs, many of which are multi-disciplinary, are currently provided through ten faculties: Art and Design, Arts, Business and Economics, Education, Engineering, Information Technology, Law, Medicine Nursing and Health Sciences, Pharmacy and Science.

Monash University is a richly diverse and multicultural community serving indigenous and recent Australians together with students from over one hundred other countries. The latter, mainly from Malaysia, Hong Kong, China, Singapore and Indonesia make up some 30 per cent of all enrolments. Of these, over 5000 students are enrolled in overseas programs outside of Australia, mainly in the Asia Pacific region.

The information presented in this document comes from the annual student, staff, research and finance statistical collections submitted to DEST, from the Monash annual reports and from reports compiled by AVCC.
